Tool Box Safety Talks VHS (*approximately 5 minute run time*)

180.1 Fire Extinguisher Operation- Demonstrates the importance of knowing how to properly operate a fire extinguisher and describes the different types of extinguishers.

180.2 Eye and Face Protection- Explains the importance of eye and face personal protective equipment and details various types of eye and face protection.

180.3 Compressed Gas Safety- Explains the importance of safely handling and storing compressed gases on construction sites. Pinpoints specific hazards associated with use of compressed gas.

180.4 Hand Protection- Illustrates the many different uses, types of hand protection, and describes the most obvious hand hazards.

180.5 Foot Protection- The importance of safety footwear is discussed in this personal protective equipment video which illustrates the various types of protective footwear and their specific uses.

180.6 Hearing Protection- Explains the dangers of not adequately using personal protective hearing equipment and covers the various types of hearing protection.

180.7 Ladder Safety- Instructs workers how to work safely with ladders. Emphasizes ladder safety for job-built ladders and manufactured ladders.

180.8 Working Safely on Scaffolds- Scaffolds are used throughout the construction industry and this tape will assist workers in learning scaffolding safety.

180.9 Working Safely with Crane Rigging- Shows how important it is to properly rig crane loads. Emphasizes safe rigging practices and working around crane loads safely.

180.10 Powder Actuated Tool Safety- Instructs construction workers in the safe operation of powder actuated tools by covering the hazards and describing appropriate safety measures.

180.11 Chemical Safety- Describes hazards associated with chemicals and how workers can best protect themselves.

180.12 Working Around Construction Equipment Safely- Describes safe work practices for personnel working around construction equipment.

180.13 Working Safely Around Explosives- Describes protective measures to be used when working with explosives.

180.14 Construction Equipment Maintenance- Explains the importance of equipment maintenance relative to safety and instructs workers to ensure their vehicles are operating safely.

180.15 Safety Belts for Vehicle Safety- Shows the importance of safety belt usage.

180.16 Traffic Control- This video illustrates the importance of work zone safety and emphasizes safe work practices.

180.17 Carbon Monoxide Safety- Covers the dangers of working around carbon monoxide and how to do so safely.

180.18 Warning Signs- Explains the importance of observing warning sign messages in construction.

180.19 Working Around High Voltage- Explains hazards of working around high voltage and how to do such work safely.

180.20 Head Protection- Demonstrates the need for all construction employees to wear protective headgear.

180.21 Employee Accountability- Discusses the construction workers' obligation to work safely for their own protection and the protection of their co-workers.

180.22 Skid Steer Loader Safety- This 9-minute video covers the basic safety procedures for working with or around skid steer loaders.

112 Hazard Communication Orientation- *The System That Works:* This fast-paced, informative presentation is a valuable training resource for your workers. Topics covered include what each individual can do to help ensure a safe site.

117 Preparing for COMET- A new organizing effort, which stands for Construction Organizing Membership Education Training. COMET encourages union members to seek employment with open shop firms and initiate organizing efforts.

131 Controlling The Field- *Jobsite Safety Inspections:* This 13-minute video gives guidance to construction contractors and supervisors regarding the appropriate approach to regular Jobsite safety inspections, which help to prevent accidents/losses.

132 Just The Facts- *Accident Investigation:* Explains how best to investigate construction accidents a vital function toward preventing recurrence of similar accidents.

133 Clearing The Air- *Confined Space Entry:* This 16-minute video discusses the potential dangers of confined space entry and shows contractors and employees how to enter these spaces safely.

134 Success At The Top- *Stairway and Ladder Safety:* This tape satisfies most of the training requirements outlined in OSHA's new stairways and ladders standard.

135 The Choice Is Yours- *Guide to Personal Protective Equipment:* This presentation instructs employees on the importance of using personal protective equipment, ways to increase personal safety and minimize potential construction hazards through the use of head, eye, hand, and respiratory protective equipment.

136 On Solid Ground- *A Plan For Safe Excavation And Trenching:* This is an informative step-by-step guide to OSHA's new excavation standards and covers

optional methods of sloping, shoring, shielding and benching.

137 Take Charge- *Working Safely With Temporary Electricity:* This video has been developed to train construction employees on the hazards involved in working around temporary electricity and the precautions to make this a safe operation.

138 The Winning Ticket- *Housekeeping On The Jobsite:* This explains the dangers of working on an unkempt jobsite and measures to take to ensure an organized, clutter-free jobsite.

139 Safety- *The Bottom Line:* This video is designed to show the value of sound safety programs and their economic benefits contractors.

142 Play It Safe- *An Overview Of Crane Safety:* This 15-minute video highlights basic crane safety practices for crane operators, riggers and laborers working with and near cranes.

143 The Rules Of The Game- *Employee Safety Orientation:* This 14-minute video outlines fundamental construction safety practices for new employees and provides refresher training for veteran employees.

145 Exposing the Facts Lead - *Exposure in the Construction Industry:* This video describes how lead is used in the construction industry, its effect on the human body and how workers can protect themselves from over exposure.

146 Controlling The Load- *Crane Rigging Safety:* This 14-minute video describes the basics of crane rigging safety.

147 The Sky's The Limit- *Scissors And Aerial Platform Safety:* This 15-minute video highlights potential hazards associated with construction work performed on elevated platforms.

148 On Your Guard- *Power Tool Safety:* This 13-minute video covers hazards associated with power tools and shows safe power tool use.

149 Back To Basics - *Back Injury Prevention:* This 18-minute video covers safe work practices for protection against back injuries.

150 Make The Right Move- *Materials Handling Safety:* This 14-minute video shows how to safely handle common construction materials and highlights materials handled improperly.

151 Avoid The Heat- *Fire Prevention In Construction:* A 15-minute video covering common fire hazards and fire prevention.

152 Avoid Hot Mix Hazards- *Working Safely with Hot Mix:* Provides basic safety training to road construction workers exposed to hot mix hazards.

153 Pave Your Way To Safety- Concrete Paving Safety.

154 What Goes Up Must Come Down- *Demolition Safety*: A 12-minute video on the primary hazards associated with demolition operations and how workers can protect themselves and the public from these hazards.

155 A Firm Footing- *Pile Driving Safety*: This video describes several of the most common pile driving hazards and suggests protective measures for pile drivers and others. 12 minutes.

156 Step by Step- *Job Safety Analysis*: Walks contractors and construction supervisors through a step-by-step process for identifying potential construction hazards.

157 Take Control- *Lock-Out/Tag-Out*: This video shows the appropriate methods for locking-out/or tagging-out stored energy so that maintenance and repair work on machines, equipment and other energy sources can be performed safely.

158 A Part of The Process- *A Contractor's Guide To Process Safety Management*: This 14-minute video is designed for contractors performing industrial construction where hazardous substances are being processed. It teaches contractors how to work safely in industrial process facilities and to comply with OSHA's new process safety management standard.

159 Think Again- *Substance Abuse On The Jobsite*: This video presents the dangers of substance abuse on the jobsite and how to detect early warning signs of substance abuse.

172 Breathing Easier- *Respiratory Protection in the Construction Industry*: The Basics of Respiratory Protection. Designed to provide the basic information necessary to use respiratory protection safely.

173 Breathing Easier- *Respiratory Protection in the Construction Industry*: Selecting, Fitting and Maintaining Respirators. This video is designed to provide contractors and their workers with information necessary for properly selecting, fitting and maintaining respirators.

174 A Safe Span- *Bridge Construction Safety*: Provides bridge construction workers with basic information on common bridge construction hazards and appropriate methods for protecting themselves from the hazards.

175 Hot Work- *Welding and Cutting Safety*: This 14 minute video has been developed to train construction workers on how to work safely around welding and cutting operations.

176 On the Go- *Forklift Safety*: This 17 minute video was produced to provide basic

safety training to construction workers that are working with and or around forklifts.

177 Take the Lead on Lead- *OSHA's Lead Standard:* This 18-minute video walks construction contractors and supervisors through OSHA's new lead standard for construction.

178 Sound Advice- *Hearing Conservation:* This 13 minute video covers work safety practices for proper hearing conservation on the jobsite.

179 Heightened Awareness- *Fall Protection In The Construction Industry:* This 20 minute video is designed to educate contractors about OSHA's new Fall Protection Standard and to train workers on the different types of fall protection systems and how and when to use them.

181 The Best Strategy - *Personal Protective Equipment:* This 17-minute video instructs workers about personal protective equipment, including equipment required by the new Fall Protection Standard.

183 Getting the Job Done Safely - *Worker Safety Orientation:* This 14 minute video outlines fundamental construction safety practices for new workers and provides refresher training for veteran workers.

184 Making the Move- Trailering Construction Equipment Safely: This video shows the viewer how to safely load, transport and unload construction equipment. 12 minutes.

189 The Road to Safety- *An Overview of DOT Commercial Driver Drug and Alcohol Testing Requirements:* This 13-minute video will educate supervisory personnel on drug and alcohol-testing requirements, how to train employees on the different protocols for properly testing workers for drugs and alcohol, and explain the training required for supervisors and workers.

190 Putting it All Together- *Scaffold Safety:* This video was developed to train construction workers how to safely erect and dismantle scaffolds. 15 minutes.

192 In the Trenches- *Excavation Safety for Workers:* This video teaches the viewer how to work in and around excavations and trenches safely. 14 minutes.

193 Work Zone Ahead- *Highway Work Zone Safety:* This video provides basic safety training for road construction workers. 12 minutes.

194 Think Ahead- *Driver Safety:* This video provides instruction on safe driving practices for construction workers required to operate motor vehicles while on the job. 14 minutes.

200 Highway Work Zone Structures Safety- This video produced by Iowa State University covers some of the typical hazards around the construction of bridges and culverts, with emphasis on falling objects, and crane hazards.

201 Highway Work Zone Plant Site Safety- This video produced by Iowa State University describes what to watch out for if you are a pedestrian on the ground, a crane operator, or a truck driver, traveling between the plant and construction sites. Length is 10:30 minutes.

202 Highway Work Zone Grading Safety- This video produced by Iowa State University covers some of the safety hazards you will find on typical grading sites, from clearing and grubbing to final grading. Emphasis is on personal responsibility for safety and awareness of the hazards. Length is 14 minutes.

203 Ten Forces- Meeting the Challenge of Change: This video details the ten forces, which shape our lives, and describes how to use them to your advantage in the business world.

204 Heaven Sent- A Career In The Construction Industry: An ideal tool for school presentations, this video shows the advantages of a career in the construction industry in a fun and interesting manner.

205 Company Identification Program on Preventing Loss from Theft- Details the establishment and operation of a law enforcement program, which marks equipment and tools for easy police and jobsite identification.

206 Guidelines For A Successful Construction Project- This program analyzes the benefits of teamwork on the job between the general contractor and his subcontractors.

207 Drug-Free Workplace- This film covers the drug use problems in the workplace and what management can do to deal with their concerns. This video is 109:17 minutes long and was developed in 1986 (more for management than employee viewing.)

208 Crime Prevention- A Management Tool: A video cassette presentation which drives home the point that theft and vandalism losses cut into a contractor's profit margin.

209 Careers In Construction- This video is an excellent tool that can be used for career days, and student workshops. If you are ever asked to speak at a high school, this video is a "must have."
